Subject: Urgent Notification Regarding the Current Situation at Sri Lanka Cricket

I am writing this letter to bring to your attention a matter of grave concern currently unfolding in the cricketing landscape of Sri Lanka.

At this very moment, the Parliament of Sri Lanka is engaged in a debate centered around Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC). The primary objectives of this debate, orchestrated by the Minister of Sports, Mr. Roshan Ranansinghe MP, are deeply troubling and have significant implications for the democratic principles and autonomy of our cricket board.

- 1. Expulsion of Elected Office Bearers of SLC;
 - There is a concerted effort to expel the duly elected office bearers of SLC without any substantiated or proven guilt or misconduct on their part by approving a motion in Parliament. This goes against the democratic election process through members and undermines the fundamental principles of fair governance.
- Introduction of a Constitution for SLC through Parliament;
 The Parliament aims to bring forth a constitution for SLC without any reference to the SLC or its membership. This maneuver seeks to bypass the established structures and procedures within the SLC, violating the Constitution of ICC and placing undue influence on the SLC by the legislature.

The timing of these actions is particularly suspect, coinciding with the disappointment felt by the public following Sri Lanka's loss to India in the World Cup, it appears that the Minister of Sports is capitalizing on this moment to push through changes that serve his personal interests.

Your prompt attention and action on this matter are crucial to ensure the protection of the democratic processes within SLC and the broader principles upheld by the ICC and preserving the principles of cricket administration and protecting the reputation of the sport in our nation.
